### **Description of Public Administration**

The purpose of the MPA program is to educate students for careers in management and administration at the federal, state, and local levels of government and non-profit organizations. Contemporary public management demands a wide range of analytical and communicative skills. The MPA Program at The University of Georgia is designed to develop professionals who can use their educational experiences to work productively at all levels of public sector management, as well as in research endeavors. The MPA program also gives students the opportunity to specialize in nine broad areas. These include: Local Government Administration, Public Finance Administration, Public Management - Organization Theory, Public Personnel Administration, Public Policy, Health Policy and Administration, Non-Profit Administration, Human Services Administration, and Higher Education Administration. Whether students choose a concentration or go for the generalist degree, graduates of the MPA program can obtain administrative and management positions at all levels of government, non-profit agencies, and, to a limited extent, in the private sector.
